BACKGROUND OF AZAT FOUNDATION (AF)

Azat Foundation is a not for profit and non – governmental organization, established on 17th February 2003 by a group of young Development Professionals, Human Rights Activists, Researchers, Media Professionals and Political Activists.

Azat Foundation got registered under “The Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Ordinance, 1961” (Registration No. EDO-CD/30) on 2nd June, 2005. got registered under Societies Registration Act 1860 on 8th November, 2008 (Registration No. 1229). AF is engaged in advocacy, campaigning, community mobilization, research, networking, challenging anti poor policies, plans and actions at local, national and international level with different coalitions.

Azat Foundation is currently registered under Balochistan Charities Registration & Regulation Authority dated 1st December, 2020 having Registration # **BL-8931822523841790**.

Since its inception, AF has covered at least 22 districts of Balochistan and has worked to ensure a peaceful and secure environment within communities. AF’s goal is to eliminate poverty and violence from society by means of encouraging human rights and civic education culture. AF has been in the forefront of organizations calling for the integration of civic education and human rights concepts into the entire society; not only at the local level but also at the wider Provincial Level.

AF has developed a trans-cultural model of the “**Right to Health**” approach and commitment to social justice and change in the region by examining health in the context of people’s life – moving beyond the individualistic approach in order to include extended family, social, cultural, political, religious and economic conditions. The model is based on analyzing the links between health and human rights focusing on the community approach and development. Such a model has been developed through capacity building, professional advancement, professional credentialing, and the ability to act as an ethical change agents in a constantly changing environment by empowering family and community initiatives in alliance with existing community resources. AF has distinguished for its leading position in the region as an organization of excellence in capacity building, professional practice and of its critical analysis of the linkage between basic health and human rights. AF is proactive and innovative in efforts to alleviate inequalities in health, education and women rights making family empowerment more accessible and culturally acceptable while providing each individual with dignified service. AF has gained distinction for our critical analysis of the contextual linkage between health and human rights, and contribute creatively to the local, regional and global right to health approach movement and prevention of torture. AF will achieve this by basing health practice and research on the philosophy of “**Right to Health**” approaches and the holistic framework of people’s rights where the focus is not only on the mind, body and spirit, but also on the context where individuals live.

AF also works for development of unprivileged and less developed communities and responses disasters in disaster prone areas to make sure all human exercise equal rights and get equal opportunities of development. AF believes that health professionals have a strong role in building bridges for peace, democracy and human rights through community empowerments and professional’s developments. We extend our hands to all individuals and

nations who are interested on human rights, dignity and respect regardless of their race, color, religious background and political affiliations.

Azat Foundation (AF) exist for the establishment of a society in which every person can exercise its right to a life of dignity and can have equal access to all the available resources on the earth.

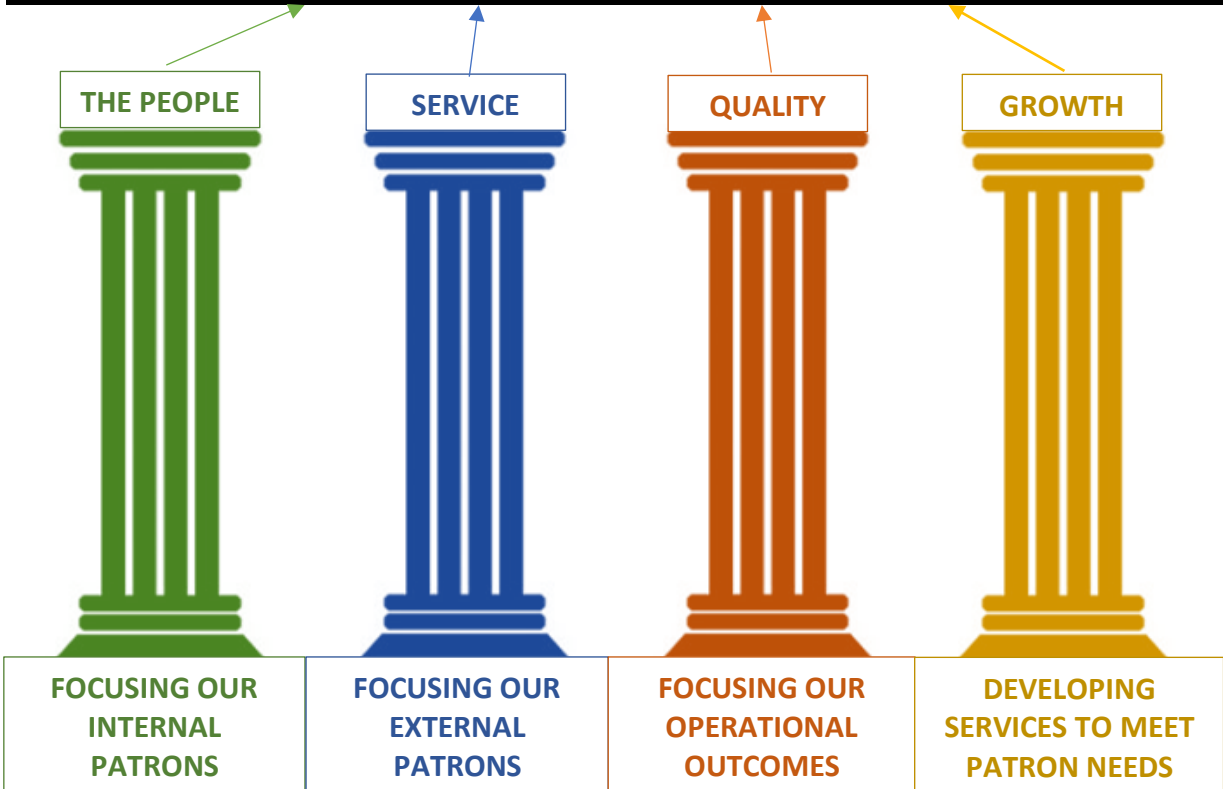

Azat Foundation has adopted the strategy of mass mobilization and awareness, advocacy, campaigns and community development for achieving its goals. Azat Foundation strongly believes in participatory approach of community awareness and development actively involving the local communities and other key stakeholders in the process.

Geographically, Balochistan is the largest province of Pakistan with scattered population of 7.0 Million (Approx.). It has 33 districts and population is found densely in some of the districts such as Quetta (Provincial Capital), Pishin, Qila Saifullah, Qila Abdullah, Sibi, Loralai and Khuzdar.

22 out of 33 districts are covered by Azat Foundation where inhabitants belong to different ethnicities and cultural backgrounds. These below given targeted districts have been targeted due to different rationales of ethnicity, rampant illiteracy, extreme poverty and social protection issues.

STRUCTURE OF AZAT FOUNDATION

Azat foundation is governed by a body of 16 members which are also the founding members of the organization and is managed by 07 Board of Directors (BODs) who belong to diversified qualification, exposure and experience. Majority of BOD members have a rich experience in Education Sector which is the core thematic area of Azat Foundation. The meetings of the BOD members are held on bi-annual basis.

Azat Foundation has formed a 4-members Executive Committee (EC) including Chairman (BOD), Executive Director (ED), Head of Programs (HOP) and Regional Manager. The Executive Committee directly reports to the BOD members and is responsible for taking decisions of the organization in its best interest. The meetings of the Executive Committee are held on quarterly basis.

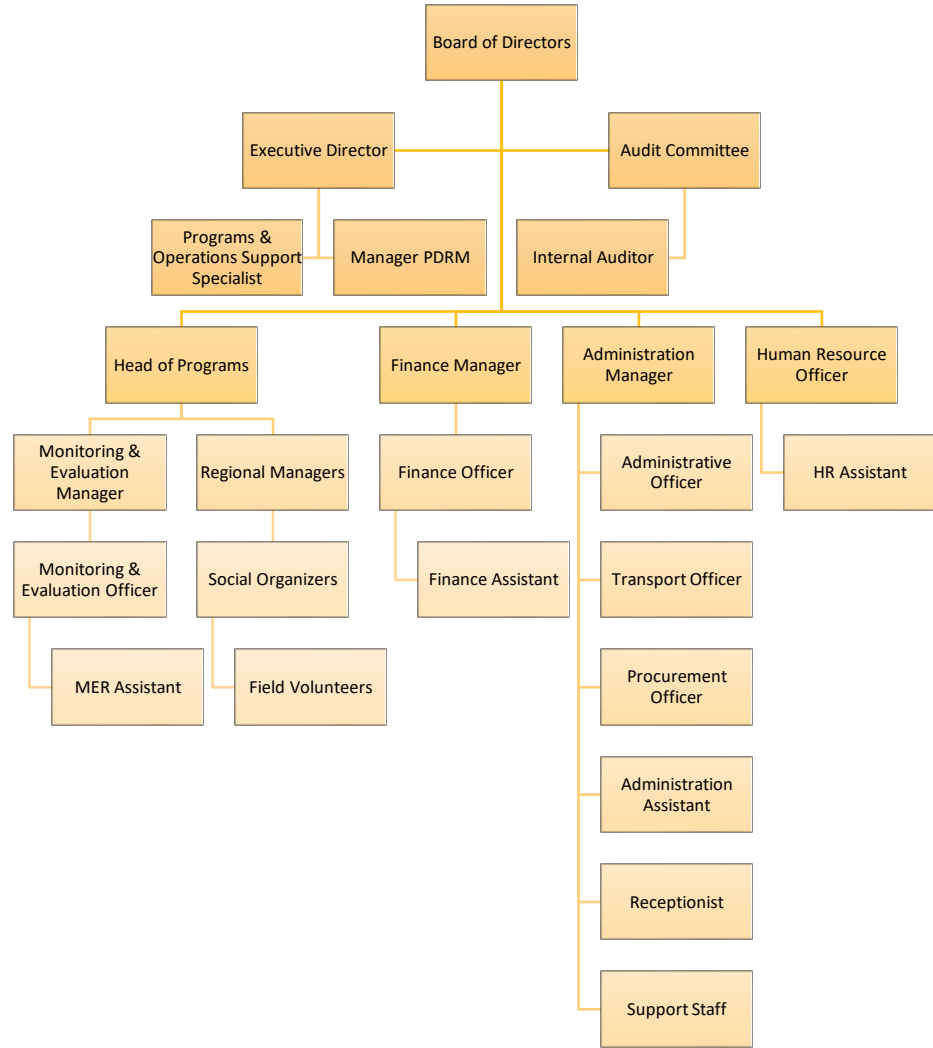
Azat Foundation also have a fully functional 5-members Project Management Committee (PMC) that is responsible for managing/steering the project(s)/program(s) in hand by the organization.

Azat Foundation has also formed 3-members Recruitment Committee composed of Head of Programs, Programs & Operations Support Specialist and Human Resource Officer that are responsible for the selection of candidates against positions vacant.

The Procurement Committee of Azat Foundation (consisting of 3-members including Head of Programs, Finance Manager, Project Manager & Technical Person If Required) manages the overall procurement made at Azat Foundation. They are responsible for the selection of the best procurement process and taking on the procurement process. These members also work as a Quality Assurance Committee in order to ensure the quality of goods/services procured.

Azat Foundation has also formed an Internal Audit Committee comprising of 04 members (03 Members of Board including Chairman & Internal Auditor) who are responsible for ensuring Transparency & Accountability of the processes of Azat Foundation. The Internal Auditor is responsible to Report the Internal Audit Committee whereas meetings of Internal Audit Committee are held on quarterly basis.

I AM THE CHANGE

Engro Corporation, a well-renowned corporation, started "**I Am The Change (IATC)**", a corporate initiative to amplify the efforts of individuals working in the fields of education, health and livelihoods for the betterment of under-privileged people in Pakistan. It is also one of the first full-fledged crowd funding platforms in the country that helps individuals and institutions to crowd-fund for CSR projects in the three aforementioned categories.

For the year 2014-15, Engro Corporation announced the winners of I Am The Change (IATC) competition in a ceremony held on 6th May, 2015 at Karachi amid the presence of various corporate veterans, media and the senior management of the Engro group.



2015 year's recipients included the **Azat Foundation** in the category of education, working to provide education and youth empowerment opportunities to individuals from various areas of Baluchistan including Noshki, Kharan, Awaran amongst others whereas total 80 nominations were received across the Pakistan for three categories.

Azat Foundation won the "**I Am The Change (IATC)**" Award for the year 2014-15 in the category of education for providing education to community on self-help basis for more than 7 years.
